What we do

The Council is made up of 18 elected councillors representing the seven wards of Central, Chawson, Copcut, East, Tagwell, West & Witton, and a small team of officers led by the Town Clerk. The Town Mayor, a position that has existed in the town since it was awarded its Charter in 1604, chairs council meetings. Council and committee meetings are held at the Council Chamber at St Richard's House and are open to the public to attend.

Can I attend meetings of the council?

Yes, all meetings of the council and its committees must be open to the general public and the press, except in very exceptional circumstances. The time and place of meetings are advertised beforehand – on the noticeboard and town council website. In Droitwich Spa, these usually are on Monday evenings and start at 6pm in the Council Chamber at St Richard's House in Victoria Square. Can I speak at the meeting?

You cannot speak while the normal business of the meeting is being conducted. However, it is good practice to allow some time at the meeting when members of the public may address the council on an issue that concerns them. In Droitwich Spa, this is at 5.45pm normally and the Question Session lasts for 15 minutes. Questions have to be registered with the Town Clerk by 1pm on the day of the meeting.
